



## Work Safety Alert Fall from a Bamboo Scaffold

1. **Date of Accident :** March 2015
2. **Place of Accident :** A building construction site
3. **Summary :**

A marble laying worker fell about 12 metres to his death from a bamboo scaffold erected between the external walls of two village houses under construction.

### 4. **Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :**

To prevent any person from falling from height, contractors/employers undertaking work-at-height should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working method and procedures;
- provide and properly maintain suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work;
- provide and ensure the use of safe means of support and/or suitable working platforms for working at height;
- where use of working platforms are impracticable, provide and ensure the use of suitable fall arresting system by workers ;
- exercise strict control with suitable warning notices displayed prominently to prevent unauthorized and improper use of scaffold;



- provide relevant safety information, instruction and training to the workers involved; and
- develop and implement an effective monitoring and supervision system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
